Product information

The glass fibre tape FibaFuse has been specially developed to provide strong reinforcement for board joints and cracks on walls and ceilings. It's easy to work with. Filler penetrates the porous tape, eliminating any blisters during application.

The tape is easy to cut and retains its fold when inserted in internal corners, for example.

FibaFuse is a light, but above all thinner tape compared with a standard quality paper tape. Ideal if the surface has no recess, for example in cross joints, cracks in concrete or on a cement board.

FibaFuse minimises the occurrence of visible joints in raking light through its thin design, which reduces the risk of creating a raised joint.

Mould-resistant in accordance with ASTM D3273 mould test.

Use

FibaFuse can be applied both automatically with a Taping Tool Banjo or Bazooka, and with a hand tool. Protective gloves must be worn. The tape is recommended for use with a filler that is approved for embedding paper strip and meets CE-marking requirements in accordance with EN 13963.
